### **INCLUSIONS AND OTHER DETAILS**

#### 1. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Distance Learning Program 3 (DLP3) is a form of private education that is parent-led and home based. DLP3 is simply an educational option that allows students to finish their grade level course within the school year without having to attend physical or virtual classes. This type of distance learning is asynchronous which permits students to work at their own pace. The students will be provided of the course outline per subject and the list of requirements to accomplish in order to move up to the next level. This program is parent-led. The student may

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finish all the academic and non-academic requirements in advance. All 4 quarter assessments per subject are submitted to the school within the school year. Learning modules and other instructional materials are included. The school will also provide Digital Media Teaching Resources.

#### 2. ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

No Entrance Exam; Online Interview may apply. Kinder and Grade School transferees must submit:

- Report Card with LRN of the previous level
- Certificate of Completion
- Form 137/Transcript of Records
- Birth Certificate

#### 3. COURSE OUTLINE

The quarter course outline is the framework of what the students are expected to learn in a subject. It contains the list of topics, objectives and target skills relevant in successfully completing the course. It also includes references and suggested readings. The quarterly assessment is based on the course outline. It will be sent to the student upon enrollment.

#### 4. LIST OF REQUIREMENTS

The academic and non-academic requirements per level must be submitted and completed within the school year. The list will be released together with the course outline.

#### 5. QUARTER ASSESSMENT

One of the ways we assess the learning outcomes of students and to find out if the intended skills are acquired, is through academic achievement as measured by quarter assessment in major subjects such as Reading, Language, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science. The quarter assessment is based on the course outline where sets of skills are listed according to subject areas. The modules help to acquire some of the skills intended for the student's grade level.

#### 6. QUARTER REPORT CARD

The students under DLP3 are given summative report cards every quarter within the school year and upon completion of all the requirements per quarter. The grades of the students will be based on the quarter assessment and the submitted requirements. A digital copy will be emailed to the parents. A hard copy can be delivered to the registered address. The delivery fee will be shouldered by the parents.

## 7. REGISTRATION TO DEPED'S LEARNER INFORMATION SYSTEM

All public and private schools in the Philippines under Alternative Learning System (ALS) are directed to register and update students' Learner Information System (LIS). Every learner in the basic education system is being issued only one permanent Learner Reference Number (LRN) that the student shall use throughout the entire basic education program.

#### 8. LEARNING MODULES

Modular Distance Learning is a learning continuity modality included in the DLP3. These are individualized instructions in printed copies.

- Cycle 1 and 2: Phonics, Mathematics and Visual Motor
- Cycle 3: Phonics, Mathematics, Visual Motor, Language and Filipino
- 1st Grade: Reading, Language, Mathematics, Visual Motor, Cultural Studies, and Filipino
- 2nd to 6th Grade: Reading, Language Mathematics, Cultural Studies, Language and Filipino

#### 9. MONTESSORI MATERIALS

Most of the materials of Practical Life Exercises are found at home. Generally, the activities of practical life revolve around Care for the Self and Care for the Environment. Other Montessori materials are reproduced and replicated to send to students' homes.

#### **10. SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

Smallville Montessori provides necessary school supplies appropriate for each grade level to assist students in distance learning.

#### **11. DIGITAL TEACHING MEDIA RESOURCES**

These are tools to harness and effectively implement remote or distance learning. This includes Practical Life Exercises presentations, teaching demos, art tutorials, library of music and movements and more. Each student under this program is given a USB where all the files and links are stored.

#### **12. FREE CONSULTATION WITH TEACHERS**

Parents and teachers have to work even more closely together to maximize learning of the students. Under this program, parents can schedule a meeting with the teachers using whatever platform available. Parents may discuss existing challenges including academics, behavioral or health concerns. Consultation with teachers aim to further support families with online learning.

#### **13. PARENTS' NIGHT**

Social isolation can be lonely. Parents' Night is an event where Smallville Montessori parents gather together virtually, one Friday every month at 5PM. The program aims to guide parents on the new landscape of education, share parenting and health tips. This is a social support group of parents.
