INCLUSIONS AND OTHER DETAILS

1. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Hybrid Learning Program also called Blended Learning, is a combination of home and online learning. This is about interdisciplinary education and the integration of technology to enhance the students' mastery of the subjects, their creativity and their ability to get connected virtually with their teachers and classmates while in a risky pandemic situation. Online classes are scheduled while other lessons will be done using the modules and other instructional materials at home. The teacher is responsible for teaching major subjects i.e. English, Mathematics, Cultural Subjects and Filipino. Under this program, the student may attend a special class of literary, performing or visual arts. This is applicable for the elementary level only. SVM will provide the necessary materials and school supplies in the Hybrid Learning Program. The school also provides Digital Media Teaching Resources. There are no quarter exams.

2. ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

No Entrance Exam; Online Interview may apply. Kinder and Grade School transferees must submit:

- Report Card with LRN of the previous level
- Certificate of Completion
- Form 137/Transcript of Records
- Birth Certificate

3. COURSE OUTLINE

The quarter course outline is the framework of what the students are expected to learn in a subject. It contains the list of topics, objectives and target skills relevant in successfully completing the course. It also includes references and suggested readings. The quarterly assessment is based on the course outline. It will be sent to the student upon enrollment.

4. LIST OF REQUIREMENTS

The academic and non-academic requirements per level must be submitted and completed within the school year. The list will be released together with the course outline.

5. QUARTER ASSESSMENT

NO QUARTER EXAMS, only Home Learning Tasks

6. HOME LEARNING TASKS

These are sets of activities done at home after online classes that reinforce child's sense of independence and builds self-confidence. Getting used to home learning tasks helps the students master the skills they need to navigate the world to feel assured about doing things by themselves.

7. QUARTER REPORT CARD

The students under DLP4 are given summative report cards every quarter within the school year and upon completion of all the requirements per quarter. The grades of the students will be based on the quarter assessment and the submitted requirements. A digital copy will be emailed to the parents. A hard copy can be delivered to the registered address. The delivery fee will be shouldered by the parents.



8. REGISTRATION TO DEPED'S LEARNER INFORMATION SYSTEM

All public and private schools in the Philippines under Alternative Learning System (ALS) are directed to register and update students' Learner Information System (LIS). Every learner in the basic education system is being issued only one permanent Learner Reference Number (LRN) that the student shall use throughout the entire basic education program.

9. LEARNING MODULES

Modular Distance Learning is a learning continuity modality included in the DLP4. These are individualized instructions in printed copies.

- Cycle 1 and 2: Phonics, Mathematics and Visual Motor
- Cycle 3: Phonics, Mathematics, Visual Motor, Language and Filipino
- 1st Grade: Reading, Language, Mathematics, Visual Motor, Cultural Studies, and Filipino
- 2nd to 6th Grade: Reading, Language Mathematics, Cultural Studies, Language and Filipino

10. MONTESSORI MATERIALS

Most of the materials of Practical Life Exercises are found at home. Generally, the activities of practical life revolve around Care for the Self and Care for the Environment. Other Montessori materials are reproduced and replicated to send to students' homes.

11. DIGITAL TEACHING MEDIA RESOURCES

These are tools to harness and effectively implement remote or distance learning. This includes Practical Life Exercises presentations, teaching demos, art tutorials, library of music and movements and more. Each student under this program is given a USB where all the files and links are stored.

12. PARENTS' NIGHT

Social isolation can be lonely. Parents' Night is an event where Smallville Montessori parents gather together virtually, one Friday every month at 5PM. The program aims to guide parents on the new landscape of education, share parenting and health tips. This is a social support group of parents.

13. P.L.A.Y. PROGRAM

It means Practice Loving and Appreciating Yourself. This program is intended to develop and enhance students' self-worth. What is the difference between self-esteem and self-worth? According to a psychologist, SELF-ESTEEM is what we think, feel and believe about ourselves. SELF-WORTH is recognizing "I am greater than all things". It is a deep knowing that I am of value, that I am lovable, I matter and of incomprehensible worth". The program comes with a module and other art materials. Only students on blended learning DLP4 can avail of the PLAY program.



14. VEGETABLE GROW BOX USING KRATKY METHOD

The method is deep water culture. It supplies plants with oxygen, water and lighting to survive. To reach its full potential growth they will need macronutrients and micronutrients. Nutrients are added to the container. Plants are placed into a net pot with the growing media held by a lid and hung above the water. Plant roots are partly submerged into the water and partly exposed to the air. Each child under this program receives a vegetable growing box with seedlings.

15. SPECIAL CLASS / AFTER CLASS PROGRAM

The program enhances students' skills in performing and visual arts and literary arts or it may expose them to new interest.
